The annual Military Skills Competition (Milcomp) achieved yet other milestone by successfully hosting the 10th Military Skills Competition in Potchefstroom over the period 24 to 29 October 2016.

The 2016 Milcomp enjoyed a significant increase in the number of participants from international Defence Forces and South African National Defence Force (SANDF).

The Officer Commanding South African Army Specialised Infantry Capability Reserve (SAASIC Res) Lieutenant Colonel Henry Holder hosted the Military Skills Competition for the third time in consecutive since its inception in 2006 in Potchefstroom.
