GUNNERS' 65th ANNUAL MEMORIAL SERVICE



The 65th annual national Gunners' Memorial Service was held on 23 April 2017 in Potchefstroom at the Gunners' Memorial site. The weather was very accommodating to those attending with a pleasant overcast day. The atmosphere was filled with both excitement as well as sadness. The memorial site was well maintained as expected of the high standard that Gunners are so well known for. Launchers from 4 Artillery



Regiment, 10 Air Defense Artillery Regiment were displayed around the memorial site. The gun salute troop from and Transvaal Horse Artillery was deployed for Gun Salvos.



The Chief Dignitary on parade was Maj Gen R.C. Andersen, Chief Defence Reserve and other dignitaries included Maj Gen Mbuli (General of the Gunners) and the executive Mayor of Tlokwe, Cllr K. Khumalo. The High Commission of Japan and USA was represented. All the Gunners association's branches were present.

The SANDF UNITY HYMN which is adapted for the Gunners' National Memorial Service was sung. Lt Gen (Ret) P. du Preez, National President of the Gunners' Association, addressed everyone on parade. Lt Gen P. du Preez in his speech also spoke of the SS Mendi centenary and

The Chief Dignitary and other Dignitaries departed from the parade and were shortly followed by the members on parade. The rest of the members departed with pride and joy filling the atmosphere. The parade was a huge success and we can now look forward to the 66th Annual Memorial Service next year.
